...that in Edwardian times children weren't usually allowed to eat dinner with their parents. They ate in the kitchen with the staff or in their nursery with the nanny (if they had one).

Even up to being twelve years old you might still have had your food pureed like a baby! Grown-ups didn't think that children's teeth were strong enough to chew meat.

You would have had porridge with treacle for breakfast, pureed stew for lunch and pureed chops and vegetables for dinner. You might have been allowed toast, made over the fire with a toasting fork and smeared with dripping (beef fat) with a hot chocolate for supper.
